### Bareroot Fruit Tree Varieties Description

#### ALMOND

#### HALL'S HARDY

Quite ornamental tree with a profusion of pale pink flowers. Self-fertile, heavy and early bearer. Large nuts with hard shells and bittersweet kernels, quite hardy in coastal areas.

#### APPLE

#### AKANE

Medium size. Skin: thick, smooth, scarlet red blush; Flesh: white to cream, juicy, firm, crisp; Flavour: sub acid, tart & sweet. Quality: good. Dessert. Good for drying. Ripens September till mid November. Tree is hardy, medium sized. Mid season bloomer. Should be thinned to get good fruit size.

#### BELLE DE BOSKOOP

Medium to rather large. Skin: yellow flushed red with light russeting; Flesh: yellow, moderately juicy, firm, tender & crisp; Flavour: sub acid, slightly sweet & sharp. Quality: good. Dessert and cooking. Ripens early October till mid February. Triploid variety. Early bloomer.

#### BRAEBURN

Medium large fruit, high quality, orangey red blush. Crisp, tangy flavor. Triploid. Requires thinning, ripens in late October/November.

#### BRAMBLEY'S SEEDLING

Large sized fruit; Skin: green to yellow green, sometimes with orange red flush; Flesh: white to creamy white, juicy, firm; Flavour: sharply acid; Very good for culinary uses. Ripens early to mid October. Long storage. Triploid variety. Mid season bloomer.

#### CAYUGA RED STREAK (Twenty ounce)

Fruit is very large, usually round. Skin is thick, greenish turning to yellow, splashed with dark red. Flesh: whitish tinged with yellow, juicy. Flavour: subacid, sweet. Good quality. Culinary, exhibition, cider. Blooms mid-season, ripens early Oct. stores to Jan.

#### CORTLAND

Medium to large fruit. Skin: dark red blush over yellow; Flesh: white, highly resistant to browning, juicy, crisp, tender; Flavour: sweet, sub acid; Quality: good to very good. Cooking and fresh eating. Best for drying/freezing. Ripens early October till mid February. Early to mid season bloomer. Excellent pollinator.

#### COX ORANGE PIPPINS

Finest flavor, medium size, red stripes over orange skin. Firm, tender, juicy, aromatic yellow flesh. Late bloomer, susceptible to scab, Requires thinning.

#### ELSTAR

Medium to large size, round-conic. Skin: yellow with light red stripe; Flesh: creamy white, juicy, firm & crisp; Flavour: tart & acid; Quality: very good. Fresh eating and cooking. Ripens late September till March. Mid season bloomer. Must be thinned for optimum production.

#### EMPIRE

Medium to large size, round. Skin: thick, waxy, dark red; Flesh: creamy, juicy, firm, crisp; Flavour: good, sub acid, aromatic, sweet; Excellent fresh eating. Ripens late September till December. Early-mid season bloomer.

#### ESOPUS SPITZENBURG

Medium to large, light orange skin; Skin: tough; Flesh: crisp, fine grain, juicy, yellowish flesh. Rich aromatic flavour; Pick very late, fruit quality improves. Keeps until May. Early-mid season bloomer. Thomas Jeffersons favourite. Heritage variety.

#### FAMEUSE (SNOW)

Medium size & roundish. Skin: thin, tender, smooth, light red/pale greenish yellow; Flesh: white, juicy, tender & crisp; Flavour: good, sub acid, spicy & sweet; Dessert quality, ripens early October till January. Early bloomer. Heritage variety.

#### FIESTA

Medium vigor, similar to Cox Orange Pippin but hardier. Disease resistant but with same wonderful flavour. Fruit is medium size, crisp and juicy with white flesh. Mid season bloomer. Pick in late September to early October. Keeps to January.

#### FREEDOM

Medium to large size fruit, red stripe on yellow; Flesh: cream, juicy, tender, firm, nearly crisp with medium fine texture; Flavour: sprightly sub-acid; Quality: good for fresh eating, apple sauce & juice. Ripens end of September. Keeps till January. Tree is very vigorous, hardy. Should be thinned. Disease resistant. Very resistant to Apple scab. Mid season bloomer. Good pollinator

#### FUJI

Round medium large fruit. The creamy yellow flesh is firm, crisp & juicy with orange red skin. Late variety that will keep very well, if picked at proper time (late October). May be biannual if not thinned properly. Tip bearer. Mid-late season bloomer.

#### GOLDEN DELICIOUS

Medium to large with yellow tender skin. Flesh: White to cream, juicy, firm, crisp & tender; Flavour: sub-acid, aromatic, sweet; Quality: Good to excellent. Dessert, cooking. Pick early Oct. Mid season bloomer. Self fertile & excellent pollinator. SHOULD NOT BE USED TO POLLINATE JONAGOLD.

**APPLE (continued)****GOLDEN RUSSET**

Medium sized fruit, grey green to golden bronze. Heavily splotched with light brown russet. Crisp, highly flavoured, fine texture with yellow flesh. Fresh eating, cooking, cider & dried apple. Excellent keeper. Will keep until April. Scab resistant. Pick late October. Early season bloomer.

**GRANNY SMITH**

Medium sized, round conic. Skin: green to greenish yellow, slight blush; Flesh: greenish to yellowish white, juicy, crisp, firm & fine grained; Flavour: sweet & tart, sweetens in storage. Quality: good. Cooking, desserts. Ripens end October till January. Mid to late season bloomer.

**GRAVENSTEIN**

Medium to large, round fruit. Skin: light pinky orange flush, red stripe over greenish yellow; Flesh: cream, juicy, moderately firm, crisp, tender, fine grained; Flavour: sprightly sub-acid, savory, aromatic, tart; Quality: good to excellent; dessert, cooking, fresh eating, cider; Vigorous. Triploid variety. Early season bloomer.

**GRAVENSTEIN RED**

Improved red strain of the old favourite cooking apple. Darker red stripes, firmer, snappy white flesh with distinctive flavour. Excellent quality. Vigorous productive tree. Ripens late August to September. Triploid variety. Early season bloomer.

**GREENSLEEVES**

Medium size, round to oblong. Skin: green/yellow; Flesh: deep cream, juicy, firm, slightly coarse; Flavour: sharp in earlier season, later it is sweet, honeyed & pleasantly sub-acid; Quality: good, dessert. Pick September until December. Tree is hardy and productive. Early season bloomer, blooms a long period. Partially self-fertile.

**GRIMES GOLDEN**

Medium size. Skin: tough, clear yellow with slight red blush and fine russet dots; Flesh: yellow, moderately juicy, very firm, tender, crisp; Flavour: sub-acid and aromatic, sprightly, spicy & pleasant. Excellent dessert, freezing, fresh. Ripens early October till February/March. Self fertile. Excellent pollinator. Early season bloomer.

**JONAFREE**

Medium to large fruit, round to slightly oblate, 75% medium red over yellow green ground colour. Flesh: pale yellow, juicy, very firm, crisp, fine grained; Flavour: sub-acid, sweet and sprightly, good dessert use. Ripens early October. Stores up to 10 weeks. Vigorous tree. Fruit should be thinned. Mid season bloomer. Resistant to scab.

**JONAGOLD**

Medium to large size with red orange over yellow skin. Flesh: cream, juicy, firm, crisp fine textured; Flavour: sub-acid, almost aromatic, rich & honeyed; Quality: very good to excellent; Uses: eating, cooking, processing & dessert; Ripens October and keeps for 100 days. Triploid variety. Mid season bloomer. Not cross fruitful with Golden Delicious.

**JONAGOLD RED**

Medium to large size with red blush over yellow ground. Flesh: cream, Juicy, firm, crisp fine textured; Flavour: sub-acid, almost aromatic, rich & honeyed; Quality: very good to excellent; Uses: eating, cooking, processing & dessert; Ripens October and keeps for 100 days. Triploid variety. Mid season bloomer. Not cross fruitful with Golden Delicious.

**KING (King of the Tompkins County)**

Large to very large fruit, round to conic, sometime oblate. Skin: smooth, yellow with red stripes & flush; Flesh: yellowish, moderately juicy, crisp and tender; Flavour: lightly aromatic, sub acid, sweet, very pleasant. Quality: very good to excellent; Desserts and cooking. Ripens mid October till May. Triploid variety. Mid season bloomer.

**LAXTON'S FORTUNE**

Yellow fruit striped with red. Small compact tree. Crops well from an early age but inclined to biennial bearing. Scab resistant. Ripens during September. Mid season bloomer. Heritage variety.

**LIBERTY**

Medium to large sized fruit. Skin: thin, smooth & glossy, deep red on yellow green; Flesh: light yellow, juicy, crisp and firm; Flavour: very good, slightly sweet, sprightly, sub-acid; Quality: good. Cooking, fresh eating, desserts. Ripens early October till December. Early-mid season bloomer. Resistant to apple scab and somewhat resistant to powdery mildew.

**MACSPUR**

Medium sized fruit. Skin: brilliant cherry red; Flesh: greenish white, moderately firm; Flavour: aromatic, mild; Quality: good; Ripens mid September till January. Tree: hardy, vigorous, upright, spur type. Early season bloomer.

**Melrose**

Large flattened fruit, yellowish green and streaked dark red with russet spots, firm, juicy creamy white flesh, best for eating after Christmas, stores until April. Mid-season bloomer.

**MUTSU**

Large to very large fruit. Skin: smooth, greenish yellow to yellow; Flesh: yellowish white, juicy, moderately firm, crisp; Flavour: mildly sub acid, moderately sweet, honeyed; Juice, cider, fresh and excellent for desserts. Ripens late October till May. Triploid variety. Early-mid season bloomer.

**NEWTON**

Medium size fruit. Skin: greenish yellow, flush with brown red; Flesh: rich, aromatic, crisp, coarse, creamy yellow flesh; High quality, dessert, excellent for cider. Great keeper. Ripens in October. Mid season bloomer.

**NORTHERN SPY**

Large size fruit. Skin: thin, smooth, tender, greenish/yellow flushed pinkish red; Flesh: yellowish white, very juicy & tender, crisp, rather firm & fine grained; Flavour: sprightly sub acid, aromatic, mild, tart & delicious; Quality: excellent. Cooking, fresh eating & dessert. Ripens third week in October till April. Late season bloomer.

**PAULARED**

Medium to large sized fruit, roundish to oblate; Skin: red blush over yellow green background; Flesh: white, juicy, very firm, crisp and fine grained; Flavour: strawberry like, sub acid, tart, sprightly; Quality: good. Desserts, cooking and fresh eating. Ripens early September till October. Early season bloomer. Requires thinning to obtain regular crops.

**APPLE (continued)****POMME GRISE**

Small to medium. Skin: moderately thick, yellowish with faint red in the sun. Considerably russeted. Flesh: yellowish, juicy, firm, crisp, tender; Flavour: sub-acid, aromatic, sprightly & tart sweetness; Excellent dessert apple. Ripens September and very good keeper. Early-mid season bloomer. \*Brought to Canada by French Immigrants in 1803.

**PRIMA**

Medium to large, round conic; Skin: thick, smooth, waxy with dark red blush on bright yellow ground; Flesh: light yellow, juicy & crisp; Flavour: sweet, sub acid & mildly tart; Dessert quality. Ripens mid September till November. Early season bloomer. Resistant to apple scab.

**PRISTINE**

Medium size fruit, oblate-round, Skin: very smooth, glossy, thin, bright yellow at maturity with orange blush on sun exposed surface; Flesh: pale yellow, crisp, melting, with medium to fine texture; Flavour: pleasant, spicy, full flavoured; Quality: very good to excellent; Use: dessert; ripens early August, stores 4 to 6 weeks. Early season bloomer. Immune to scab.

**RED DELICIOUS SPUR(BISBEE)**

Large fruit. Skin: red & waxy; Flesh: firm, crisp, juicy, sweet tangy flavour; Keeps well. Tree small, compact, naturally semi dwarf. Should be thinned. Mid season bloomer.

**ROYAL GALA**

Medium size, conical to round fruit. Skin: smooth & rather tough, does not bruise easily, golden yellow bright orange red flush & deeper stripe; Flesh: yellow, juicy, very firm, crisp with fine texture; Flavour: very sweet, aromatic, slightly sub-acid; Quality is very good to excellent; Use: fresh & dessert; Ripens 3rd week in September keeps 6 months. Mid season bloomer.

**SPARTAN**

Medium to large sized fruit, oblate to round-conic; Skin: moderately thick, smooth, tough, solid dark red; Flesh: creamy white with red tinge, juicy, firm, crisp, tender very good fine texture; Flavour: sub acid, mild, aromatic and fairly sweet. Excellent for eating and desserts. Ripens late September till February. Mid season bloomer. Somewhat resistant to apple scab.

**SUNRISE**

Large sized. Skin: pink red blush over yellow; Flesh: white to cream, juicy, firm & crisp; Flavour: mild, sweet & low acid; Quality: high. Multiple uses. Ripens end of August to October. Tree is hardy, vigorous & spur bearing. Mid season bloomer.

**SUMMER RED**

Medium to large sized fruits, oblong to oblong conic. Skin: dark red; Flesh: creamy white, juicy, tender and moderately firm crisp; Flavour: mildly sub acid, sweet; Quality: very good; Cooking, dessert, fresh and sauce; Ripens late August to mid September till October. Early-mid season bloomer. Excellent pollinator.

**WINTER BANANA**

Beautiful large apple. Pale yellow, waxy finish. Moderately firm, crisp, tangy, juicy flesh. Distinctive aromatic flavor similar to banana. Keeps until March. Mid-late bloomer. Excellent for west coast conditions.

**WOLF RIVER**

Very large fruit, round or conic, rather thick skin, pale yellow covered with pale dull red. Soft, tender, creamy white flesh. Subacid flavour. Primarily used for baking and pie but also a fine dessert apple, good for drying. Very good for cooking. Very hardy, productive tree, resistant to scab and mildew. Ripens mid-Sept. to early Oct. Early season bloomer. Heritage variety.

**YELLOW TRANSPARENT**

Medium sized, round slightly conic; Skin: thin, smooth, waxy, clear white to pale yellow at maturity; Flesh: white, juicy, moderately firm, very tender, crisp and fine texture; Flavour: sprightly sub acid, tart, very sweet; Freezing and sauce, excellent cooking and good fresh; Ripens early August. Early season bloomer. Resistant to apple scab.

**APRICOT****BLENHEIM**

Medium to large, pale orange fruit with red dots. Very juicy orange freestone fresh. Sweet and aromatic, excellent for canning and drying.

**HARCOT**

Medium to large, orange fruit with a slight red blush, orange flesh freestone, very good sweet flavour, vigorous, self-fertile, good resistance to perennial canker, brown rot. Cold hardy.

**PUGET GOLD**

Large, elongated, freestone, very good flavor, prolific bearer. Blooms early, self-fertile, ripens in August.

**CHERRY****AARON**

Black, sweet & juicy. Naturally very dwarf about half size of a normal cherry tree. Self-fertile. Mid season bloomer

**ANGELA**

High quality black sweet cherry with large glossy black fruit with firm dark red flesh. Good flavour. Productive tree. Good crack resistance. Late season bloomer.

**BING**

Large, heart-shape, freestone fruits with dark red skin. Firm, meaty, purple flesh. Somewhat susceptible to cracking. Fresh and canning. Pollinated by most other sweet or pie varieties. Mid season bloomer.

**BLACK TARTARIAN**

Medium large heart shaped fruit, purplish black to red depending on site. Thick, tender, juicy, dark red flesh. Rich, sweet full bodied flavour. Best pollinator for dark sweet cherries. Excellent for home orchard. Self fertile. Late season bloomer.

**LAMBERT**

Dark red, heart-shaped fruit, slightly smaller than Bing. Strong upright tree. Resistant to late frost, heavy bearer, a little later than Bing. Pollinates with Angela, Black Tartarian, Rainier, Sam, Stella or Van. Mid-late season bloomer.

**LAPINS**

Fruit is large, excellent quality and rich flavour, crack resistant, heavy producer, resists late frost. Self-fertile. Early season bloomer

**METEOR**

Large, oblong, bright red fruit resembles Montmorency. Tart, juicy, meaty flesh, colourless juice. Naturally dwarf 2.5m to 4m tall. Self-fertile. Ripens one week later than Montmorency.

**MONTMORENCY**

Standard for pie cherries. Medium large, bright red fruits with firm, yellow flesh and clear juice. Rich tart, tangy flavour. Self-fertile and good pollinator. Requires good drainage. Ripens early summer.

**CHERRY (continued)****NORTH STAR**

Large fruited Morello -type with thin, light red skin, red flesh, red juice and small freestone. Crack resistant, naturally dwarf, early bearer. Self-fertile. Ripens from mid-June to early-July.

**RAINIER**

Large, yellow fruit with red blush. Firm, clear to light yellow flesh. Colorless juice. Very productive. Resistant to cracking. Pollinate with Bing, Black Tartarian, Lambert, Montmorency, Sam, Stella or Van. Mid season bloomer.

**SAM**

Medium large, firm, jet-black fruits. Large tree is vigorous, hardy with a good framework. Blooms later than most cherries which helps escape late frosts. Pollinated by Bing, Montmorency, Royal Ann, Stella or Van. Some resistance to cracking. Ripens early. Late season bloomer.

**SCHATTEN MORELLO**

Medium size fruits, dark red. Flesh is dark red as well as juice. Naturally small tree, self-fertile and hardy.

**SUNBURST**

Large fruit, resembles Stella, dark firm flesh, self-fertile, resistant to cracking, heavy yield. Early-mid season bloomer.

**SWEETHEART**

Large, bright red fruit with good flavour. Precocious tree requires pruning to prevent size problems. Self-fertile. Mid season bloomer. Ripens 1 week later than Lapins.

**VAN**

Large, shiny, reddish black similar to Bing but firmer, short stem. Good flavour. Good fresh, cooked or canned. Heavy producer. Pollinated by Bing, Lambert, Rainier, Royal Ann, Sam or Stella.

**CRAB APPLE****ALMEY (ORNAMENTAL)**

Fiery crimson blossoms in spring, followed by small scarlet fruits that remain on the tree in winter. Grows 4/5m tall, very hardy. Bronze coloured leaves.

**DARTMOUTH (EDIBLE)**

Large white blossoms, large crimson fruits, long stem, excellent for jellies and preserves, prolific, self-fertile.

**DOLGO (EDIBLE)**

Siberian Crab. Juicy, 3 cm, olive-shaped. Highly flavoured, rich in pectin, makes ruby red jelly, ideal for canning or preserving whole. Sturdy, upright, open tree, white blooms self-fertile and good pollinator

**FLORIBUNDA ROSEA (ORNAMENTAL)**

3cm. bright carmine flowers. Profusion of small carmine-yellow fruits

**NIEDZWETZKYANA (EDIBLE)**

Very old heritage variety with red flesh, bronze leaves and dark purplish-red flowers. A very prolific bearer, fruits are 5 cm across often more, rather moderate growth, a handsome small tree. One of the best for jelly. Very hardy variety.

**PRAIRIE FIRE (ORNAMENTAL)**

Upright tree becoming rounded with age, reddish maroon leaves, red flower buds opening to dark pinkish-red, small red fruit 9 mm. Very hardy variety. About 5m tall at maturity. Excellent disease resistance.

**RED JEWEL (ORNAMENTAL)**

Medium size tree, maturing slowly to 5 m tall. White flowers followed by brilliant red berries through winter. Excellent disease resistance.

**RESCUE (EDIBLE)**

Sweet flavour, good quality, flesh yellowish-white, good size, very hardy, self-fertile.

**ROBINSON (EDIBLE)**

Deep pink flowers, red fruits, medium size. Upright, disease resistant.

**ROYALTY (ORNAMENTAL)**

Purple foliage followed by crimson flowers and dark red-purple fruit, disease resistant.

**MEDLAR****MEDLAR (French Variety)**

Ripens late October. Pick after first frost. Self-fertile.

**MEDLAR (Hungarian Bush Type)**

Tree grows more like a bush than the "French" type. 3.5 to 4 cm fruits born at end of branch, after white blossoms. Fruits should only be picked after a light frost, when it becomes soft. Self fertile.

**NECTARINE****EARLY RED**

Early and good tasting nectarine. Red colour

**GOLDEN PROLIFIC (SUPER DWARF)**

Medium to large fruit with yellow, freestone flesh. Ripens from mid to late August. Genetic dwarf tree grows to 1.50 m tall. Self-fertile, excellent for pot

**HARDY RED**

Red color, yellow flesh, Tree is very productive and must be thinned to attain good size. Resistant to brown rot and bacterial leaf spots. Self-fertile, Ripens in early August.

**HARKO**

Medium size, roundish, bright red fruit, good texture and flavor, Self-fertile, very reliable, ripens in mid-August.

**NECTA**

Super-dwarf tree suitable for container culture, grows to about 6'. Self-fertile. Good quality fruit.

**RED GOLD**

Large to very large, almost all red fruit, firm, juicy deep yellow, freestone flesh. Excellent colour and taste. Crack resistant, self-fertile

**PEACH****BONANZA (SUPER DWARF)**

Medium to large, yellow fruit with red blushes. Highly aromatic, yellow, freestone flesh. Good flavour, very dwarf grows only to 1.50 m tall. Thrives in tubs or containers. Often fruits first year. Heavy crops. Large, pink, self-fertile flowers. Ripens late June

**PEACH, continued****FROST**

Medium to large, fuzzy, yellow fruit. Soft yellow, semi freestone flesh. Good for fresh eating or drying. Self-fertile tree, heavy fruit set, must be thinned. Most resistant variety to leaf curl. Ripens late August.

**GOLDEN GLORY**

Very large fruit, yellow freestone flesh with good flavor, super-dwarf tree suitable for container growing, 5/6' tall, self-fertile.

**GLOHAVEN**

Uniform, large, attractive freestone fruit. Very tough, mostly red skin, is practically fuzz less. Firm yellow flesh is resistant to browning. Superior quality, self-fertile. Ripens in early September.

**PACIFIC GOLD**

Large, yellow fruit, freestone, leaf curl resistant, ripens mid-August, eating and canning.

**REDHAVEN**

Medium, nearly fuzz less fruit. Bright all over red. Firm, yellow flesh becomes freestone as it ripens. Excellent for dessert, canning and freezing. Vigorous, self-fertile tree bears young.

**VETERAN**

Round, good quality, medium to large, golden yellow fruit with a slight red blush. Freestone when ripe. Yellow firm flesh, easy to peel. Excellent fresh, canned, or frozen. Self-fertile tree bears early with consistent yield. Old but dependable variety. Ripens mid-September.

**PEAR****ABATE FETELE**

Elongated Bose-shaped fruit. Yellow skin with pink cheek in sun exposed area. Excellent flavor and quality. Pollinate with Bartlett, ripens same as Anjou.

**ANJOU (Beurre d'Anjou)**

Large conical short neck fruit. Mild fine texture melting white flesh with a delicate aroma. Pick early October till January. Requires a pollinator, such as Bosc or Bartlett and good pollinator for Bartlett.

**AURORA**

Large fruit is bright yellow, slightly blushed, smooth, melting, juicy flesh with sweet aromatic flavour. High quality dessert. Ripens just before Bartlett.

**BARTLETT (Bon Chretien Williams)**

Large golden yellow fruit, blushed with brownish red. Smooth juicy white flesh. Good for fresh eating, canning or preserves. Pick early September when still green. Needs a pollinator. Mid season bloomer.

**BEURRE HARDY**

Medium to large fruit. Green yellow russet. Sweet juicy flesh, melting. Mid season bloomer.

**BOSC**

Medium to large fruit. Dark yellow fruit with brownish russeted skin. Tender, aromatic, juicy white flesh. Rich slightly acid flavour. Fine for eating, baking and drying. Pick mid September. Requires a pollinator.

**BUTIRRA PRECOCE MORETTINI**

Medium size, greenish-yellow blushed red. Melting, juicy, sweet white flesh, excellent flavor. Stores longer than Bartlett, one of the best early pear. Early bloomer.

**COMICE (DOYENNE du COMICE)**

Large broad based narrow necked fruit. Greenish yellow, rich, juicy, firm, sweet finely textured flesh. Premium dessert pear. Late season bloomer. Requires pollinator.

**CONFERENCE**

Medium to large fruit with long gourd shaped fruit. Smooth green skin tinted with russet. Pale yellow flesh with slight pink tinge. Sweet melting, very juicy. Pick late September. Mid season bloomer. Requires pollinator.

**FLEMISH BEAUTY**

Large roundish pear. Thick clear yellow skin with red blush. Firm yellowish white flesh, becoming melting a tender. Pick late September. Early season bloomer. Requires a pollinator.

**HARROW DELIGHT**

Medium size fruit, red blush over yellow. Flesh is high quality and very smooth. Similar to Bartlett but 12/15 days earlier. Hardy, very productive, very resistant to fire blight. Pollinates with Bartlett, Anjou, Moonglow.

**LOUISEBONNE (Louisebonne d'Avranche)<sup>dium</sup>**

fruit with juicy flesh. Pick mid September or before fruit starts to fall. Early season bloomer. Requires pollinator.

**MAXINE**

Bartlett type, large golden yellow fruit with snow-white flesh, free from grit cells, reminiscent of Asian Pear, sweet but not rich. Tree is vigorous, hardy. very resistant to fire blight. Ripens mid to late September.

**ORCAS**

Yellow fruit with carmine blush, large flavourful pear that is well suited for home orchard. Very versatile. Good for fresh eating, canning or drying. Tree has vigorous, open spreading habit. Ripens early September. Mid season bloomer.

**REGAL RED COMICE**

Identical to regular Comice (Doyenne du Cornice), same wonderful melting flesh and flavor. But the fruit is quite red and so is the foliage. Mid season bloomer, ripens mid to late December.

**SECKEL**

Small yellowish brown fruit Fine grained, smooth, extremely sweet, very juicy flesh. Excellent dessert pear, productive, slow growing and naturally semi-dwarf, reliable and heavy setting. Self-fertile but benefit from cross pollination.

**SIERRA**

Large pyriform fruit. With yellowish green, fine flesh. Very juicy and excellent taste. Pick end of September. Mid season bloomer.

**PLUM****BURBANK**

Japanese group. Large, purplish red fruit. Sweet, meaty, amber yellow, clingstone flesh. Excellent flavour. Best when picked before fully ripe. Excellent for eating fresh & canning. Low growing, flat topped, somewhat drooping tree. Bears early & sets heavily. Ripens mid July. Requires pollinator.

**PLUM (continued)****DAMSON**

European plum. Small to medium, oval, bluish purple fruit. Tart, juicy, golden yellow flesh. Excellent for home canning. Vigorous, self-fertile. Heavy crops. Ripens late August to mid-September.

**EARLY GOLDEN**

Japanese group, Medium size, round late September. Requires pollinator. Mid yellow fruit with red blush. Freestone. Season bloomer Best picked before fully ripe. Ripens in July. Requires a pollinator.

**GREEN GAGE**

European plum. Famous Reine Claude named after the wife of Francis 1st of France. Medium size oval yellowish/green fruit. Juicy, smooth texture, amber freestone flesh. Considered the ideal dessert plum in Europe. Good, cooked, canned or preserved. Productive, self-fertile.

**LATE ITALIAN PRUNE**

European plum. Large, oblong purple fruit. Greenish yellow freestone flesh. Reliable producer. Self-fertile, ripens mid to late September.

**MAMMOTH**

European plum. Large, oblong, purple fruit. Flesh is sweet, melting, outstanding. Self-fertile. Ripens in early September.

**METHLEY**

Japanese plum. Medium to large, reddish purple fruit. Juicy flesh with sweet mild distinctive flavour. Fine quality. Good for fresh eating. Early season bloomer. Self fertile. Ripens mid July.

**MIRABELLE**

European plum. Small, round, yellow fruit with yellow dots. Firm tender, yellow freestone flesh, sweet and mild. Good for jams, tarts, compotes and canning. Spreading tree is very productive. Ripens late August. Much grown in France where it is prized for making brandy. Self-fertile.

**OPAL**

European plum. Reddish fruit with yellow flesh. Excellent cropper. Self-fertile. Swedish variety.

**PEACH PLUM**

European plum. Large, round, brownish or purplish red fruit. Juicy yellow flesh with good flavour. Excellent for fresh eating and canning. Although self-fertile it is best to pollinate with Green Gage or Italian Prune Plum. Ripens early August.

**SHIRO**

Japanese group. Medium to large, round yellow fruit with pink blush. Juicy, translucent yellow clingstone flesh. Mild, sweet flavour. Excellent for fresh eating, cooking, canning, preserves, dessert. Spreading tree. Requires pollinator. Pollinate with Early Golden, Methley.

**STANLEY**

European plum. Medium to large oval dark blue fruit with a thick bloom. Firm tender fine grained, yellowish green, freestone flesh. Sweet rich flavour. Excellent for fresh eating, canning, preserves and drying. Flesh turns purplish red when canned. Large vigorous, spreading tree. Early bearer. Late bloomer. Heavy annual producer. Self-fertile. Ripens early September.

**VICTORIA**

European plum. Large pink to rose fruit with red dots and a blue bloom. Sweet, golden yellow, freestone flesh. Excellent variety for canning. Self-fertile.

**YELLOW EGG**

European plum. Selected for outstanding quality. Large, oval, golden yellow fruit. Firm, juicy, yellow, semi-freestone flesh. Somewhat tart flavour until fully ripe when it becomes rich and sweet. Good for fresh use or canning. Vigorous, fast growing tree. Tall, spreading habit. Very productive. Ripens from late August to mid-September. Self-fertile

**QUINCE****CHAMPION**

Large squat shaped fruit. Sweet, golden yellow fruit. Good for jelly and jam. Tree grows 4-5 metres. Big light pink flowers. Ripens during October extremely hardy and reliable. Self-fertile.

**Le BERGEOT**

Large pear shaped fruit. Good for jelly and jam. Tree grows to 4-5 metres. Big, light pink flowers.
